



The tradition of this dates back to the 13th century and its purpose was to disguise the identity of the upper-class mingling with the lower-class folk.

Throughout this panel I wanted to show the variety of colours, many bright and vibrant, and others less so, and to display the uniqueness of each of the designs for the mask and costume.

While keeping the details with the colourful costumes and accessories prominent, I have chosen to mute the backgrounds but still retain an essence of Venice, some displaying its buildings, its waterways and the Gondola boats used in its everyday use.

The entry system has been enabled on the NIPA website. Login, go to your user profile and click on Exhibition 2023 on the left side of the screen. This will bring you to the upload section.


All entries (including Print) must be uploaded to the website.

What night do you meet? Tuesday at 7:30pm from September to May for our official programme, with additional outings over the summer.

Partnerships with other clubs or NIPA: For many years we have enjoyed two print battles every season, one against City of Belfast Photographic Society and one against CB Camera Club, with each club taking turns to host the event. The club also has a strong association with NIPA: John Hill was one of the founding officers of NIPA, Vittorio Silvestri is the External Competitions Officer and a member of the Competitions Committee as well as a Past President, Chelle McGaughey is NIPA Secretary, and Helen Honeyman chairs the Child and Vulnerable Adult Protection Committee.

Top subjects: We see a wide variety of photographic genres from our members, including portraiture, sport, landscape, architecture and nature photography. As well as taking part in the NIPA Interclub Competition, we also have a range of in-house competitions including Photo Essay, Irish Heritage, Outings and Practicals, and Flora and Fauna. Our Annual Exhibition is the highlight of our season and the culmination of a year's work; it covers ten different sections which are a mix of novice, advanced and open categories, each with an engraved trophy for the winner. Our oldest trophy dates back to the year we were founded, 1906!

Points to note: CPA host the annual Will McCrum Memorial Competition for Portraiture which aims to celebrate the life and talents of one of the club's and Northern Ireland's most well-loved photographers. It is open to everyone and features large size prints which were Will's favourite medium. The competition has been running since Will passed away in 2012.

Member Profile: Vittorio Silvestri

Many people will know Vittorio from his work with NIPA, where he was Vice President 2014-2016, President 2016-2019, and Immediate Past President 2019-2021. In his current role as External Competitions Officer, he has responsibility for the NIPA Exhibition, the Inter-Regional Wildlife Competition against the IPF, and the PAGB Inter-Federation competitions. As a member of the Competition Committee, he is at every judging and every adjudication event; displaying the images, liaising with judges and selectors, maintaining the NIPA website, and producing certificates – just some of the jobs he regularly undertakes.

What is less well known is his dedication to the Central Photographic Association over the past 35 years. Vittorio joined CPA in 1988, making him one of our longest standing members.

His first officer post was as Secretary, serving a staggering 22 years between 1990-2012, while also overlapping with additional roles as Exhibition Secretary and Programme Secretary. In 2013 Vittorio was presented with Honorary Life Membership of the club; John Hill is our only other member to have such status. Vittorio was Chair between 2012-2016, and at the end of his double term the Committee voted to appoint him to a newly created position of Club President in honour of his amazing commitment to the club.

Since 2017 he has again held the role of Exhibition Secretary, and as Competition Secretary ensures that all our Interclub rounds run smoothly. During the Covid-19 pandemic, Vittorio set up our online competition entry system and hosted club meetings on Zoom, allowing us to continue with our programme, something that was greatly appreciated by all our members at such a difficult time.

Whilst we have a dedicated Committee who have responsibility for the running of CPA, there is no doubt that Vittorio is the glue that has held the club together over many years.

PAGB Trial Two New Levels for Awards of Photographic Merit

In response to demand from Individuals, Clubs and Federations, the PAGB is introducing, on a trial basis, two exciting new ways to achieve an Award for Photographic Merit.

BPAGB

The Badge Level will be assessed at exactly the same standard as the CPAGB but will require fewer images and a slightly lower passing score.

7 Prints required, Entry Fee £42

- Entry is available under the same conditions and criteria as apply to CPAGB applications.
- The entries will be included in the CPAGB category, and the Adjudicators will not be told which are CPAGB entries and which are BPAGB entries. They will thus be voted on according to the same criteria against the same standard as the CPAGB.
- Entry is not available to holders of the CPAGB.
- The entry is 7 images. The passing score for BPAGB will be 125. The normal review procedure of near misses will apply. Entrants achieving 125 or more will be awarded a BPAGB Certificate and Badge*.
- *A newly sourced badge, identical to the CPAGB but White.

EPAGB

The Excellence Level is a step up from DPAGB, assessed at exactly the same standard but with a significantly higher passing score.

15 Prints required. Entry Fee £90

- Application for the Excellence Award is only open to existing holders of the DPAGB in Print, PDI or AV who have held the DPAGB for at least 11 months and who are still current, active members of an affiliated Club.
- The entries will be included in the DPAGB category, and the Adjudicators will not be told which are DPAGB entries and which were EPAGB entries. They will thus be voted on according to the same criteria against the same standard as the DPAGB.
- No images which were used in the previously successful DPAGB entry can be used for the entry for EPAGB.
- The passing score for EPAGB will be 330. The normal review procedure of near misses will apply. Entrants achieving 330 or more will be awarded a EPAGB badge*. Entrants failing to achieve 330 but achieving 300 or more will be awarded a further DPAGB certificate and badge but the post nominal will remain unchanged.
- *A newly sourced badge -similar to the current DPAGB with an added "scroll".

Both new levels are now open for entry for the next Adjudication in November but, for this trial, only applications in Prints will be accepted.

CEWE

Whilst I (Anita) was over at the Masters of Print in Birmingham, I was introduced to the printing lab CEWE. I have negotiated a deal for NIPA Clubs and members with CEWE.

Each club can print 20-25 images on their 7 different paper types.

CEWE have asked that when the images are uploaded that they include the club name so they can create sets for each club. If more than 1 person from each club submits images then CEWE will split the images across the materials, for example a different image on each material or have 1 image across the photographic papers and another image across the wallart range.

Either way each club will receive a set of images on 7 types of material.

As a follow up on the papers, I am in discussion with CEWE about a **virtual lab tour**, via Zoom as an online talk, discussing their papers and printing processes.

Discount offer

This will end 11pm 31st May 2023.

CEWE will then change this to the 10% off for orders over £30 but a new code will be provided for this at the time.
